definition based on objectives, qualifications, competencies and training profile

inclusion in the National Catalogue of Qualification

How to get the **Certification?**



High school: level IV

RVCC (Recognition, Validation, Competences **Certification**) long life learning

3 years (10th-12th school year) professional certification



"Youth worker"

Certificates between 2015 to 2023

- 145 issued in professional courses
- training)
- 32 issued in RVCC processes



185 issued in EFA (Adults' education and

362 total of certificates issued

(in 8 years gives an average of 45 certificates per year)

In 2023: looking back and reflection

- Is the profile attractive enough?
- Is its formula updated and valid?

- Should the certification be compulsory to work in the field of youth?
- Does it respond to the real needs of the target group?
