4 Participation of young people in information:

1. Youth networks web site (youth councils, NGOs, associations have a common web site for information dissemination)

2. Youth newspapers, now exist 77 school newspapers elaborated and disseminated by young person, student newspapers in each university

3. School radios, programmes created and broadcasted by young persons

4. Voluntary activities: young persons are involved in different social and information campaigns, out-reach activities etc.

5. Network peer to peer educators which unfolds different information activities on health issues etc.
