

5 Legal basis/legislation for voluntary activities in general and for young people in particular

5.1 Legal status of volunteers

No specific legal status for volunteers exists at this time. Their legal status is provided through the different laws for the NGOs

5.2 Taxation/tax exemptions for volunteers and volunteer organisations

At the time being, there does not exist a tax relief for donations Voluntary organisations, organised on the basis of the private law relating to associations have special tax grants because of their public usefulness and non-profit-making. Compensations for voluntary activities are liable to taxes as all other income.

5.3 Existence of social protection of volunteers

If voluntary activities are compensated they have the same social protection as employees, otherwise no social security system exists for volunteers. But volunteers are insured through the NGOs they are working for. A legislative solution for the problem of social protection of volutareers is aimed for.

5.4 Legal situation of unemployed young people participating in voluntary activities

Compensations for voluntary activities are liable to taxation as other income. Unemployed young people participating in voluntary activities are treated in he same way as other voluneers.

6 Programmes

6.1 Programmes and plans on volunteering (national, regional, local)

The "Volunteers Action Programme" was unanimously approved by the Austrian Council for Voluntary Work and will be furnished to all federal ministers, provincial governors, competent provincial government members, the Austrian Association of Cities and Towns, the Association of Austrian Municipalities, the presidents of interest groups and chairpersons of NPOs represented in the Austrian Council for Voluntary Work for their information and appointment of experts responsible for implementation in the working groups. Furthermore, it is intended to submit the Volunteers Action Programme as a petition to the Federal Parliament and Provincial Diets. It defines voluntary activities and recommends - the survey of the measures to promote voluntary commitment, - the establishment of volunteering agencies, - the certification of voluntary work, - the implementation of a basic curriculum for futher training of volunteers and for voluteers management - a research on the sitution of voluntary activities in Austria - the establishment of a working group to discuss measures and proposals with regard to liability under civil law, - the enlargeent of the General Social Insurance Act - and the discussion of other implications of volunteers work on legal status and the status of social protection

8.1 Recent (this year) developments in the area of voluntary activities

Establishment of an #Austrian Council of Voluntary Work# in 2003 under the presidency of the Minister of Social Security, Generations and Consumer Protection. Last year the Volunteers Action

Plan was approved by the Austrian Council of Voluntary Work to improve voluntary activities in Austria.

The number of people participating in voluntary activities is decreasing like the meberships in organisations in general.

8.3 Description of quality standards used in voluntary activities

Development of quality standards is a work in progress. The recommendation to establish curricula for training for volunteers and for volunteers management is one step in this direction.

8.4 Description of measures to improve the quality of voluntary activities for young people

Measures recommendated in he Voluteers Action Plan: Certificate voluntary activities: Volunteers are marked out by their special qualifications. In order to visualise this and turn it into a career asset, plans have been developed to introduce and disseminate a work certificate with which to recognise the voluntary work Establishment of volunteering agencies in the major Austrian cities, to undertake the following tasks: #provision, counselling and monitoring of volunteers and organisations, #(further) training of volunteers and their co-ordinators, #development of framework conditions for voluntary commitment and creating awareness for issues of voluntary work, #interface between NPOs and for-profit facilities (corporate social responsibility), #initiating and handling of projects (e.g. through the education project exchange), #evaluation of projects. Nation-wide implementation of the basic curriculum to professionalise (further) training of volunteer activists in the form provided and evaluated.

Volunteers Action Plan recommends different measures to improve young peopleZs volunteering like certification for voluntary activities, nation wide curricula for training, legal framework and social protection for volunteering.

9.3 Existing obstacles

The Volunteers Action Plan is still a form of recommondetions. So up to this day no nation wide curricula for trainings exist, no certificates for volunteering that are accepted in the labour market exist and the problems of the legal status and the social protection of volunteering are not completely solved.
