Award: The Liechtenstein government has announced to improve the supporting conditions for volunteering activities and has launched a competition ("ehrenamtlich engagiert") for best volunteering projects. The winning projects will be presented in April 2011.

Incentive: There is a legal basis in the Youth Act (2009, Kinder- und Jugendgesetz, Support of Youth work, Art. 82 and Jugendförderungsbeitragsverordnung Art 13-22) to promote and support volunteering in youth work by reimboursement and training. A youth leader (e.g. who helps in or organises a youth camp) can be reimbursed for up to 5 five days a year per 60 CHF (when under 16 of age) /120 CHF (when over 18) a day. He/she has to apply in advance at the Office for Social Services /Division youth office.
