




1. All over Europe young people have been hit most by the economic crisis.







2. In countries with a culturally rooted VET system, young people have been less affected – but ---




# 3. ... many of them are employed on a temporary contract, with a considerable gender difference!





Figure 30: Temporary employment rates, EU27 and Euro17, 2001–2010



# Youth unemployment rates in 2010 and change of youth unemployment rate 2007 - 2010











Figure 5: Youth unemployment rate by gender, EU27 and Euro17, 2001–2010





#### Citizenship protects against unemployment..





## Criteria that make a difference- summed up:

- gender ("Measured by unemployment rates young males have been more strongly affected by the last recession than young females.")
- citizenship ("In the EU27 and Euro17 the unemployment rates of young non-citizens are higher than those of natives.")
- educational levels ("[...] the lower qualified group has suffered most from the recession.")



#### In the second quarter of 2013 the four initial projects....

- · jointly filled 324 job vacancies with young jobseekers from another Member State;
- · supported 212 job interviews in another Member State;
- provided 267 relocation allowances to support young job-finders to settle in another Member State;
- · supported 368 preparatory trainings for YfEj job-finders.
- supported 55 SMEs for integration trainings for YfEj job-finders.
