

Initiating the Working Group





Objective of the Working Group

Development of globally relevant safeguarding standards -> 11 STANDARDS

Verification of feasibility of safeguarding standards -> 3-year RESEARCH

Proliferation and use of safeguarding and child protection principles -> ILS & sportanddev



Set Up of the Working Group

Founders: UNICEF, II / UKS, SAD, KCS, StC, RTP, NSPCC, WW, CommSec, BS

Standards: Founders+ Research: Brunel University, Oak Foundation ILS:

1. governors: Rwandan, Barbados gov, S4S, US OC, IF (FINA, Sailing, Netball), etc.

2. deliverers: Laureus, RTP, HWC, MYSA, CfHope, CommGamesFed, etc.



The Standards

- 1. Written POLICY in place
- 2. PROCEDURES, PERSONNEL & SYSTEMS agreed upon
- 3. MINIMISING RISKS for children by assessing and eliminating possibility for abuse
- 4. Written GUIDELINES for behaviour towards children
- 5. EQUITY principles adhered to
- 6. Continued COMMUNICATION with all stakeholders (children, parents, coaches, management staff, communities)



The Standards

- 7. EDCUATION and TRAINING
- 8. ADVICE and SUPPORT in case of incident
- 9. PROMOTION and PROLIFERATION of STANDARDS
- **10. INVOLVING CHILDREN**
- 11. MONITORING & EVALUATION



International Learning Sets

Ca. 40 organisations involved: divided by governors & deliverers

Digital process: doodle request for participation, meetings set, 1.5-2 hour meetings

Decentralized process: ILSs proceed at their own speed, participation at availability, 2-6 meetings / year

RESEARCH interim results

How can the standards be supported in implementation?

Top-down leadership: within organisations and within international – national structures

Bottom-up leadership: create ownership of the people working on the ground for the standards by keeping them up-to-date, a matter of interest and day-to-day care, of communication with all stakeholders especially children

Horizontal learning and networking: interacting with peers in similar organisation, join efforts,

Horizontal learning is perceived as the least confrontational & most effective
