- 11. We do have an annual budget for GolfMark, which differs annually but is quite limited, as it is mainly for any re-prints of literature, online system amends etc and doesn't cover the officer costs
- 12. We currently have 8 England Golf Regional Development Officers who oversee the delivery of GolfMark within their counties and sign off the accreditations. There are a further 35 county development officers who actually work with the clubs to achieve GolfMark. These county officers are not directly employed by England Golf, but do receive funding through the England Golf Partnership to support activity and capacity within their County Golf Partnership and therefore support the delivery of this national programme.
- 14. 746 clubs have now worked through the process and have been awarded of which around 597 are currently in date (149 are currently in the process of being re-assessed 3 year process) at present as we are moving onto a new system this figure is quite high as we are not re-assessing any clubs.
