Mapping Educational and Career paths for Youth Workers 31 May – 1 June 2018



YFU youth workers

- Volunteers (e.g. host family interviews, orientations for exchange students, schools presentations)
- Staff working in offices (e.g. programme, inbound and outbound co-coordinators, national directors)

Training

- Educational opportunities at European level for youth workers in a form of training courses, seminars, conferences, workshops, multimeasure projects
- Some YFU organisations provide training for youth workers at a local/national level and have well-developed training structures, others lack even basic youth worker trainings
- Non-formal education methodology
- Preparation before the training includes involving the National organisation and content preparation
- Supporting follow-up plans (most successful with multi-measure projects)



Topics

- Content and choice of training theme depends on the current organisational priorities and strategy
- Recurring Trainings for Trainers and Coloured Glasses trainings
- Core TOPICS:

Leadership, Human Rights education, organizational management, volunteer management, Global and Active Citizenship, intercultural training, communication skills, training and facilitation, project management, personal and social development



Competencies

- Depend on the role of a youth worker (inbound co-ordinator, volunteer co-ordinator, orientation leader, trainer of facilitators or trainers, etc.)
- Competence Framework for Trainers and Quality Assurance Framework for CG facilitators and trainers
- Top COMPETENCIES of youth workers, recurring in various educational events:
 - Leadership/ ability to motivate young people, Communication/ presentation skills Organisational skills/ project management, Ability to analyse youth (group) needs, Facilitating learning & personal development of young people,
 - Teamwork, Intercultural skills, Problem solving/ conflict management, Encouraging active citizenship of young people



Career paths within YFU

For unpaid youth workers (volunteers)

- Each organization has their own possible career path for volunteers (STEP Further manual)
- Various roles a volunteer can take up (STEP UP manual)
- ETN or PoR member
- CG Facilitator or Trainer
- Staff member in a YFU office
- Internships in YFU offices

For paid youth workers (staff)

- Taking up another role in a YFU
 office (e.g. from inbound to
 outbound or volunteer co ordinator, national director, etc.)
- Working in a similar role for another YFU office
- Working for international / European YFU structures



Career paths outside of YFU

YFU youth workers frequently end up in positions related to

- Event organisation / planning
- NGO management and administration
- Grant writing
- Project co-coordination
- Professional Training & coaching
- Intercultural education
- International institutions
