 - Development of competence frameworks
 - Self-assessment of trainers
- Policy frameworks
 - Translations
 - Cooperation at national level

 - Cooperation at European level
(e.g. SNAC EYWA, EC Expert Group on Youth Work)
 - Review and Evaluation
(e.g. CoE Recommendation on Youth Work, YP Mapping Youth Work Ecosystems)

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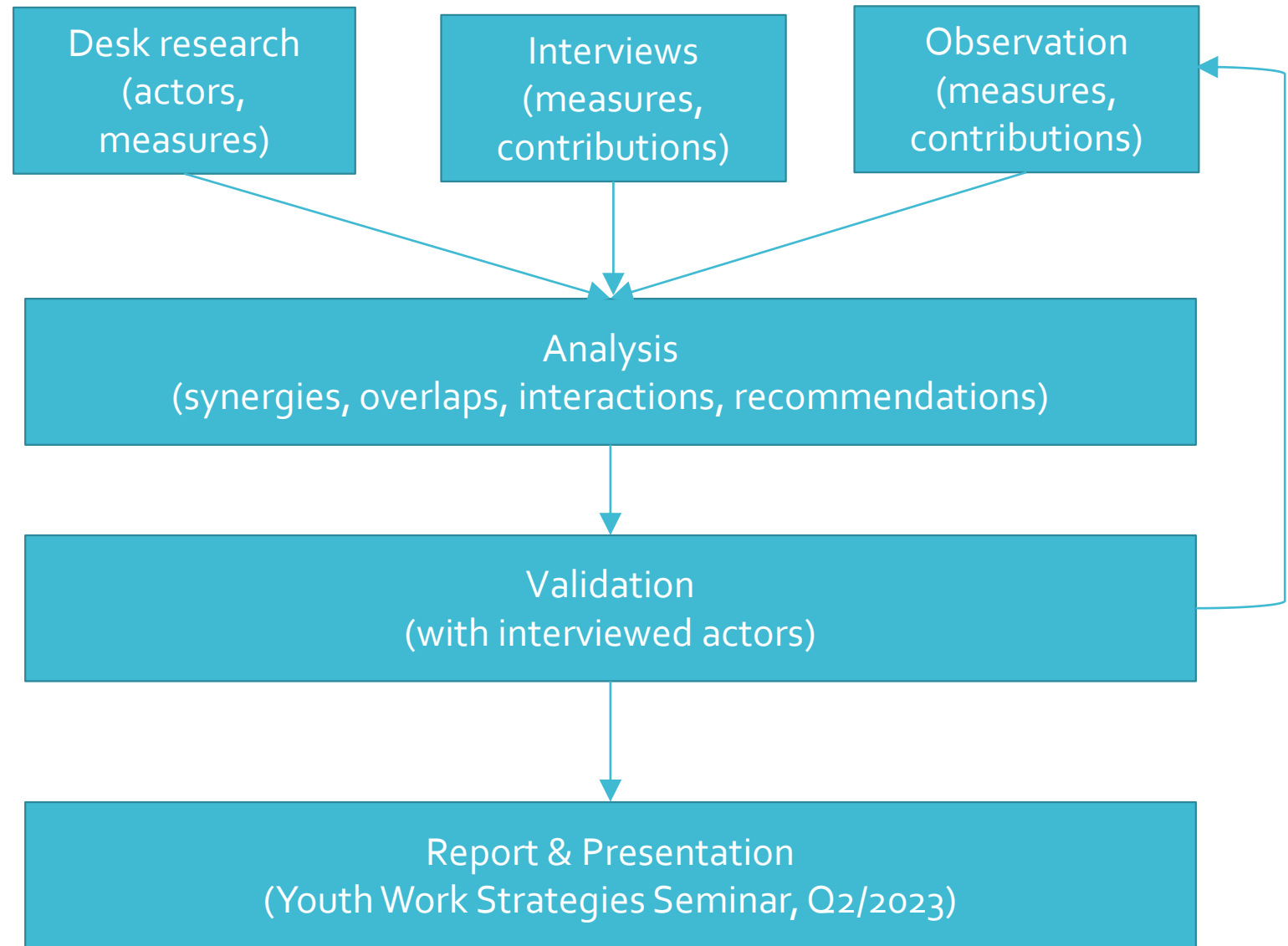
Research “Mapping European Youth Work Ecosystems”
