- > contributes to the development and recognition of youth work and volunteering in the Western Balkan region (complementary to other efforts of the EU enlargement policy).
- > is established by the European Commission in 2002, situated in



- > Commitment to the European cooperation in the field of youth and the Bonn process.
- > Promoting the Erasmus+ Programme (youth field) and the European Solidarity Corps as mechanisms to put the European policy priorities in practice (namely the EU Youth Strategy).
- > Working towards better recognition of youth work by advocating for its role to create positive change in the society.



- > Supporting the development of youth work at the local level through:
- √ capacity-building activities for organisations;
- √ supporting local structures ("Contact Points") promoting the programmes;
- ✓ the initiative "Europe Goes Local" supporting youth work at the local level and integrating the European dimension in it.
- > Studies have shown the positive impact of the programmes extending from individual to organisational and systemic levels.



- > Encouraging cooperation within and beyond the community of youth work practice by:
- ✓ bringing different actors and knowledge from different perspectives together;
- √ bridging the European dimension with the regional and local;
- ✓ cooperation in different strategic frameworks at the European level with the aim of strengthening of the role of youth work in different ecosystems relevant for young people's development and well-being.
- ➤ Need identified: to map and analyse relevant stakeholders relevant for the Western Balkans and to increase exchange, networking and cooperation among them. (Stakeholder mapping and analysis 2022 2023).

- > Supporting quality youth work:
- ✓ By promoting the values and principles of youth work (participation, active citizenship, inclusion, diversity, non-formal learning...);
- √ through competence development activities;
- √ through supporting experts.
- > Need identified: to develop education of youth workers in international youth work.



- > Providing opportunities for youth work to seize its potential to respond to the changing society and newly emerging needs of young people.
- > Responding to digital and ecological transformation, new ways of integrating into the world of work or into the society as a citizen.
- > Important concepts: innovation, digital and green youth work, civic education in Europe, youth entrepreneurship and entrepreneurial competence in youth work.
