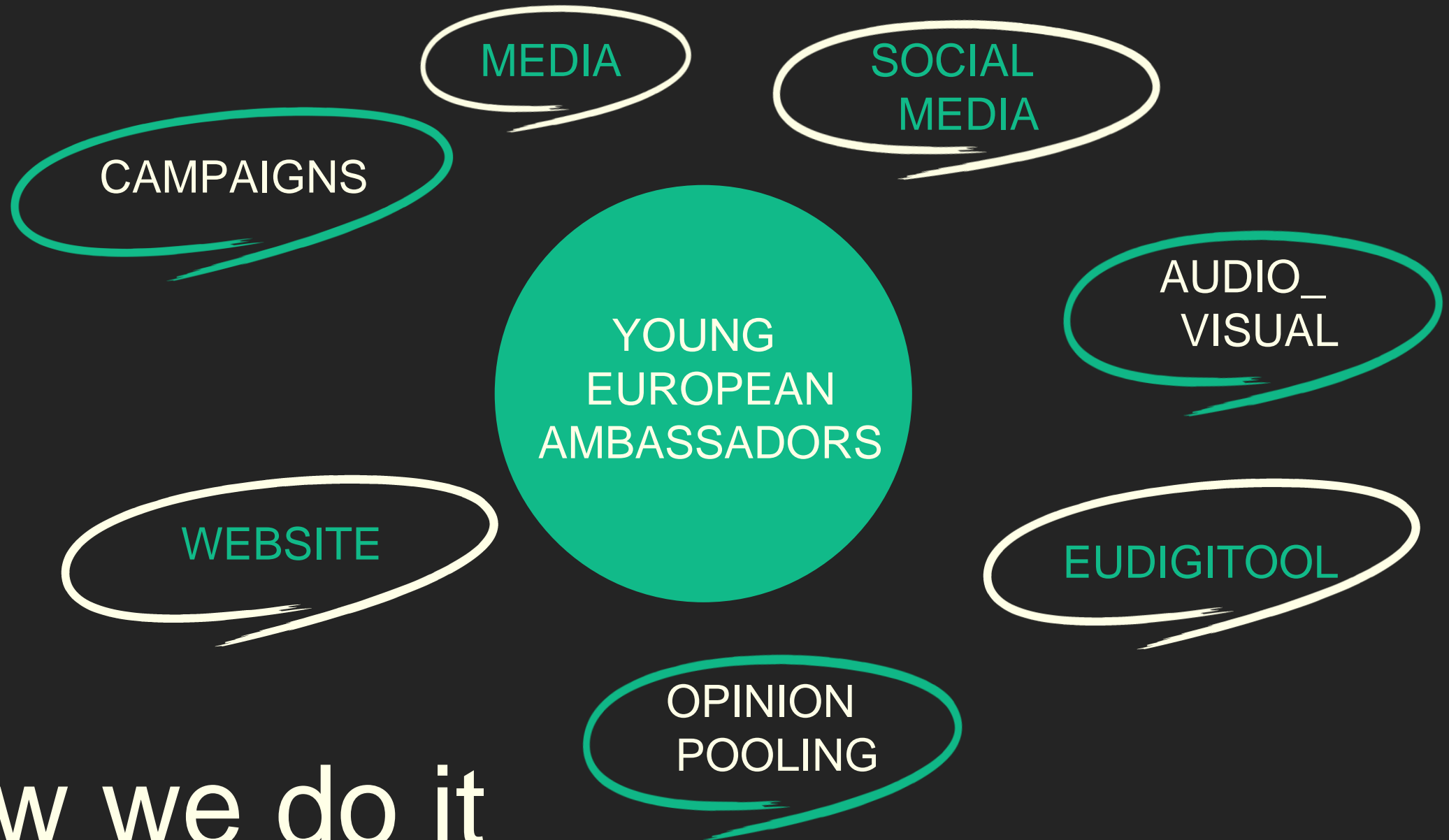

Young European Ambassadors (YEAs)

The YEAs initiative is a non-political, voluntary, vibrant communication network connecting and building bridges of friendship among young people (16–26 years old) from Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Georgia, the Republic of Moldova, Ukraine and the EU Member States and the United Kingdom.


The aim of the network is to raise awareness about the EU's, its cooperation with the Eastern partner countries, showcase the tangible results of this cooperation, contribute to policy dialogue on various topics, help increase civic activism and youth work.



Role of a Young European Ambassador

- * To disseminate correct information about the EU
- * To inform creatively young people about the EU and EU-funded opportunities for youth (by sharing own experiences)
- * To increase the visibility of the relations between the EU and EaP countries and its impact on citizens
- * To encourage the civic engagement among youth

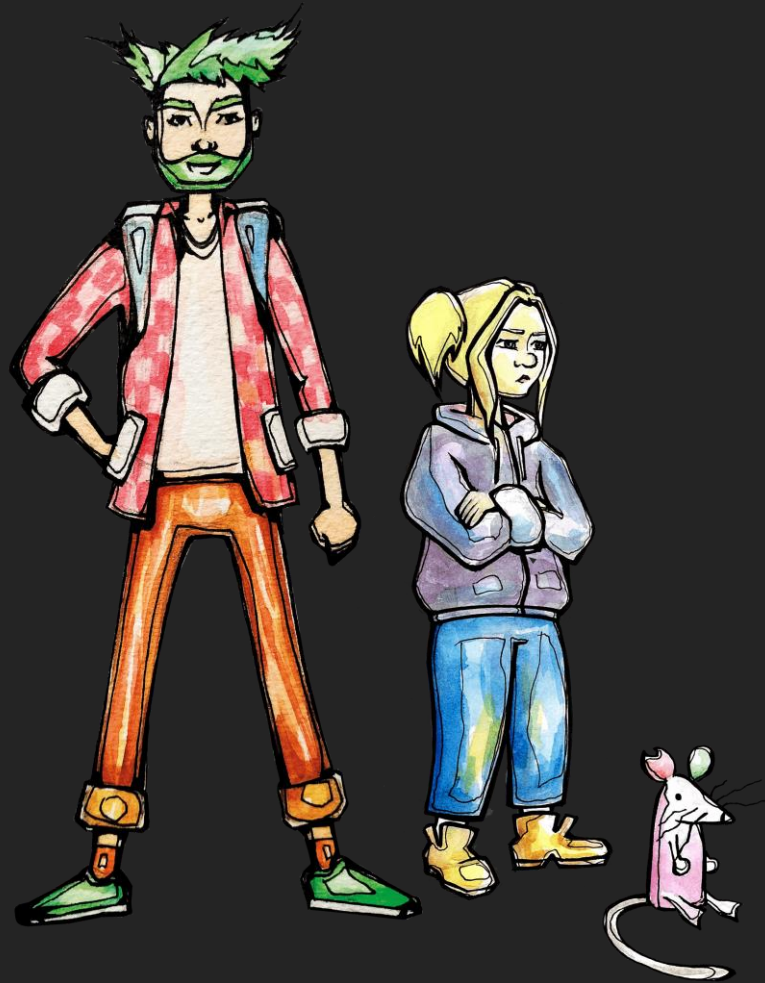
