
# **CROSS-SECTORAL POLICY**




## HORIZONTAL CROSS-SECTORAL CO-OPERATION

Can take a thematic focus, and bring youth sector organisations together with those working with youth in other sectors such as education, social work, housing or justice.

Can involve national youth council, representatives of youth civil society as well as independent experts, practitioners and reasearchers.

Can be inter-ministerial and occur between different government departments and units or take a form of public-private relationships.



VERTICAL CROSS-SECTORAL CO-OPERATION

Can bring together different levels of public administration, including national, regional and municipal levels.

This mechanism helps to assure cohesion between national youth policy and local youth strategies and a shared approach to various policies.

Can also help connect youth policy-making bodies and young people. For example, a group of young people can meet to discuss their influence on youth policy and impact of other policies on young people.


