The Youth Partnership is a **long-term co-operation programme** between the **European Commission** and the **Council of Europe** in the youth field since 1998.

Its overall goal is to **foster synergies** between the priorities and programmes of the partner institutions on specific issues of common interest to help **achieve greater European unity**.

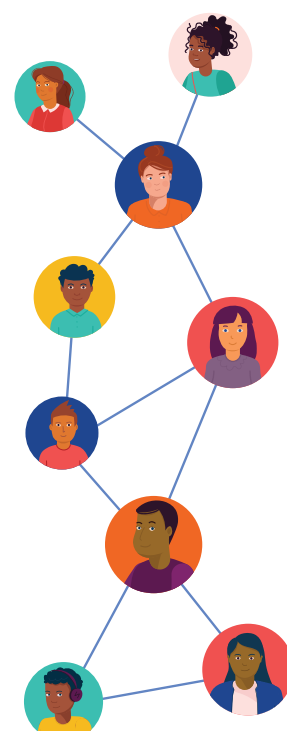


It **provides added value** to their respective work, on implementing the aims of:

In our work, we rely on networks of experts and researchers, including:

- **European Knowledge Centre for Youth Policy (EKCYC)**, providing knowledge for evidence-based youth policy making.
- **Pool of European Youth Researchers (PEYR)** and **PEYR Advisory Group**, generating knowledge on key themes of the work programme.
- **Experts** on youth policy, youth work, communicating youth research, and knowledge translation, from across Europe.

The **work of the Youth Partnership** encompasses all Council of Europe member states, Kazakhstan and the Holy See. Some of the activities have an explicit focus on Eastern and South-East Europe.
