

Chapter 6, § 84 specifies that the Federal Government must submit a report on the situation of young people & the efforts & achievements of youth services to the German Bundestag (Parliament) & the Bundesrat (Federal Council) in every legislative period.

The Federal Advisory Committee on Youth matters (Bundesjugendkuratorium, www.bundesjugendkuratorium.de) organises a well developed dialogue between practitioners, policy makers & researchers. It advises the Federal government in basic questions of youth services & in cross-sectional tasks of child & youth policy. 15 youth service experts are called into the Committee for one parliamentary session. In its activity the Committee takes position with & gives recommendations with regard to present priorities in the child & youth policy of the Federal government.
