Youth and Policy (quarterly, NYA) - critical study of youth affairs, youth policy and youth work. Journal of Adolescence (Academic Press, six issues p.a.) - international, broad based, cross-disciplinary journal that addresses issues of professional and academic importance concerning development between puberty and the attainment of adult status within society. Journal of Youth Studies (Routledge, quarterly) - international scholarly journal devoted to a theoretical and empirical understanding of young people's experiences and life contexts. Children and Society (National Children's Bureau, 5 issues p.a.) - informs all those who work with and for children about significant developments and research findings. Scottish Youth Issues Journal (University of Strathclyde, two issues p.a.) - forum for reflection on policy and practice and for dissemination of research on issues affecting young people. Some issue specific research journals also published youth research, e.g. Health Education Journal, Youth Justice
