Total amount in 2008 is 695 088 euros. Each Lithuanian municipality has a fund for funding Youth activities. Usually funding is made upon successful applications.

LiJOT is the organisation, that represents youth interests for Lithuanian governmental institutions, promotes youth initiative, youth mutual understanding and etc.

National association of Youth Coordinators (NJRK), www.njrk.lt. This is the association that unites municipal co-ordinators for youth matters. They are responsible for local youth policy formation and implementation in Lithuanian municipality.

Council of Youth Affairs formed on the principle of parity: 6 representatives from government institutions (ministries and Government Office) and 6 representatives from youth organisations (delegated by National Youth Council). The Council composition is approved by Prime minister. The Council is advisory body for the Director of the Department of Youth Affairs under the Ministry of Social Security and Labour.
