2 Legal basis or guidelines for activities leading to a better knowledge and understanding of youth

The Science Law deals with issues of research in general.

From 2002 to 2007 the **Conception of state policy towards children and youth was** in force, which emphasised the importance of proffessional research and gathering of information, that are necessary for active and modern youth policy. Conception of state policy towards children and youth defines needs and optimal conditions for quality education and professional training of young people, their involvement into social life and for development of competences and talent in the frame of school education and also outside of school. Special attention is given to revitalisation of pedagogical research as well as information gathering towards young people with health disabilities in regard to preparation for future career and labour integration. The conception anticipated establishing National institute for children and youth with special tasks in the scope of research.

Act on support of the youth work (282/2008) has come into force since September 1st 2008. The law will guarantee improved conditions for forming young man as active citizen, who participates in the quality of his own life. The Youth Work Support Law entrusts the Slovak Ministry of Education with the task of preparing conditions for youth research. In the conception of the state policy towards youth for 2008 – 2013, the youth research is mentioned as means to define the measures of this policy taken towards children and youth at the local, regional or national level. Conception material **Key scopes of state policy in relation to children and youth in Slovakia for 2008 – 2013** defines aims, principles and priority fields of government, self-administration and other subjects' agency in selected scopes of children and youth life.

<u>Action plan of youth policy for 2008 – 2009</u> is the latest document, which especially in thematic parts Education, Information and communication technologies, Employment and Questionnaire on Better understanding of Youth - Slovak Republic

Youth participation on social and political life not only emphasises the necessity of systematic information gathering as the basic material for modern youth policy creation, but also name the concrete steps to achieve this goal together with responsible institution a subjects (ministries, higher territorial units, luventa, Youth council Slovakia)

6. Methods and approaches for gaining a better understanding and knowledge of youth and for keeping it up to date

Scientific research of youth realised at universities or scientific institutes uses methods typical for the given scientific fields. Empirical researches use quantitative methods (survey, face to face interview, and telephone interview - CATI) and qualitative methods (depth interview, focus groups, case studies, content analysis of documents). Non-governmental youth organisations or other subjects of the youth work do their own research activities using amateur questionnaires, which are difficult to evaluate. They do not have the preparation phase with empirically verifiable hypothesis; they do not use specialised statistical programmes for data processing, such as SPSS. Their representativeness is problematic, even if they manage to gather answers from a large number of respondents.

7. Quality assurance strategies and tools regarding knowledge in the field of youth used in the country

An expert group of the Slovak youth research coordinators began its existence under the Slovak Youth Institute and the Slovak Youth Research Society: it evaluates youth surveys, offers methodical support and individual consultations, and publishes the outcomes of the surveys and information about the theoretical-methodical questions and procedures, standardised research techniques for various problem areas of the youth life.

8. Promotion and support to youth researchers and other actors, who work towards a better knowledge of youth, and their generational renewal

During the university preparation of their students for baccalaureates and masters, the universities are looking for the so called "scientifically oriented types" and offer them opportunities of PhD study. Grant programs KEGA and VEGA under the Ministry of

Education offer financial means for the professors for their research. Some universities even have their own grant schemes for the support of especially talented PhD students. A research analysis about the conditions of generational exchange has been carried out in the framework of pedagogical-research workers. Many young scientific-research workers are leaving before they vindicate their PhD work to find work in private companies due to financial motivation.

The student mobility is supported by various programmes and agencies like the Slovak Academic Information Agency or the Life-long Learning Programme Agency.

There was a research analysis about the conditions of generation exchange organized by pedagogical-research workers. Many young science-research workers are leaving to private companies before vindicating their PhD works due to financial motivation.

9. Networking and support of networking

9.1 Seminars and working groups for a better knowledge and understanding of youth

The Slovak Scientific Societies Council under the Slovak Academy of Science associates 50 scientific societies in Slovakia.

Seminars on the topic of youth, or other topics interesting for youth, are realised in cooperation with all the relevant scientific disciplines. The presented research outcomes are discussed with experts from the area of youth work, youth citizens' associations or with young people from respective schools, cities, regions.

9.2 Is there a permanent national network for a greater knowledge and understanding of youth linking all actors in the field?

The Slovak Youth Institute, in cooperation with the Slovak Youth Research Society, is building a network of youth research experts, whose task is to watch and initiate research activities at their universities and research workplaces in order to enhance knowledge about youth as a matter ground for framing the local and regional youth policy and the like.

9.3 Networks on youth issues specific to certain actors

Nowadays there is a natural concurrence not only among various workplaces of one university, but also among professional workplaces of all the universities and SSA. Special forms of getting over this state are the so called Centres of Excellence for various areas of research activities, which concentrate the available research potential around themselves.

From 2007, under the influence of EuNYK meeting, researchers network has been being built in the scope of youth in Slovakia to substitute decisive academic-research branches and research institutes and to integrate researchers, which work in various civil society subjects, youth associations, alliances and trusts.

9.4 What transnational networks with relevance for national networks are there?

The Slovak experts are cooperating with ESA (European Sociological Association). One section of the ESA is called Research network 30 - Youth & Generations, <u>www.youthgenerations.org</u>. They also cooperate with ISA (International Sociological Association). In this association, the RC 35 – research committee Sociology of Youth is traditionally active. 9.5 Describe the organisation and the ways of promoting interdisciplinary dialogue on youth issues.

Inter-resort cooperation at the governmental level is realised to solve various problems concerning youth, for example Roma children and youth education, pathological events prevention, conception of the state policy towards youth and the like.

Council for children and youth at Ministry of education has been working since 2007, which reflect some strategic documents but also can propose minister of education various measures and strategic steps. From 19 members, two members are actively working in research.

After having adopted Key scopes of youth policy towards children and youth document in Slovak republic for 2008-2013, joint committee first met in may 2008. Its task is the effective and complex measure preparation leading to conception fulfilment. Members of this group are representants of government sector and municipality, as well as members of civil associations and various institutes, which work with youth. Document does not explicitly mention researchers' participation, but their meeting participation will be regularly provided and their opinion and recommendations will be heard and included into decision.
