5.1 Legal status of volunteers

Voluntary activities & Voluntary Service No specific legal status for volunteers exists at this time. Volunteers have to act along the general legal conditions which partly regulate voluntary work, especially with the aim to protect the volunteers from the special risks of volunteering, to compensate [financial] disadvantages resulting from volunteering, to promote volunteering through possibilities of qualification or counselling offers, to create individual incentives for volunteers, to make volunteering possible. Civic Service Although the relationship between volunteers of the civic service & host organisations &/or assignment locations is not considered as employment, it is treated as equivalent with employment with regard to the public law protection regulations. The relevant employee protection regulations apply, such as the Employee Act, Workplace Ordinance, Youth Work Protection Act & Maternity Protection Act. FSJ/FOEJ participants will be covered by social insurance & will receive pension, accident, health & rehabilitation as well as unemployment insurance. (www.bmfsfj.de/Kategorien/gesetze,did=5644.html). Civilian Service For the Civilian Service the #Act on the Alternative Civilian Service of Conscientious Objectors# is in force. In accordance with this law, the young men doing alternative service shall not have any disadvantages in the field of social rights or social insurance. Therefore, they can get grants to the social insurances & other benefits. www.zivildienst.de

5.2 Taxation/tax exemptions for volunteers and volunteer organisations

There are very little taxation/tax exemptions for volunteers. Many of the volunteers, in contrast, pay for the costs rising from their activities as for example gasoline, telephone, training, etc. If they get expense allowances, these are up to a certain sum tax-free. Tax exemptions for non-profit making volunteer organisations do exist.

5.3 Existence of social protection of volunteers

Voluntary Activities Most of the people engaged in voluntary activities have an accident insurance, which is paid by the organisation where the volunteer is active. Each volunteer can protect himself with a personal liability insurance, but not all of the voluntary activities are included in these privat insurances. In this case the organisation, where they work, is responsible for the insurance. Voluntary Service Volunteers who carry out a voluntary service have to care about their insurances themselves. Often, the organisation offering the places, also helps to conclude the necessary insurances. Voluntary Services abroad For those, carrying out a voluntary service abroad, additional insurances & measures for the social welfare are necessary, depending on the host countryŽs conditions. as independent members in the government insurance plan. For participants, who carry out the FSJ or the FOEJ abroad the organisations sending the participants abroad are obliged to take care of the necassary social insurances & to guarantee the necessary insurances protection in the foreign country. For participants, who carry out the Voluntary FSJ or the FOEJ abroad the child allowance is paid on. Civilian Service For the civilian service the #Gesetz ueber den Zivildienst der Kriegsdienstverweigerer (Zivildienstgesetz # ZDG)# is valid (www.zivildienst.org/a/a1.htm). In accordance with this law, the young men doing alternative service shall not have any disadvantages in the field of social rights or social insurance. Therefore, they can get grants for the social insurances & other benefits.

5.4 Legal situation of unemployed young people participating in voluntary activities

Unemployed people can participate in voluntary activities without having disadvantages in respect to their earnings-related benefits. This is regulated by the #JobAQTIV# law. It says, that a voluntary work is as long irrelevant for the reception of earnings-related benefits as the professional integration is not affected. If the activities take more than 15 hours a week it has to be reported to the job centre (Arbeitsagentur).

6.1 Programmes and plans on volunteering (national, regional, local)

- national The Voluntary Years of Social Service (FSJ) & of Ecological Service (FOEJ) is open to anyone who has finished his/her obligatory period of full-time schooling, is under age of 27 & would like to volunteer 12 to 18 months of their time to apply to complete a voluntary year in Germany or abroad. 7 Relationship between different types of voluntary services

7.1 Relationship between military service, civilian service, civic service and voluntary service

The civilian service is based on the compulsory military service. It is a service which is regulated by the state & is considered (as is the basic military service) as a service under public law with detailed legal regulations. These laws do not exist for the civic service (Voluntary Year of Social Service # FSJ; Voluntary Year of Ecological Service - FOEJ), but the laws regulating these services determine the minimum standards for the protection of the volunteers & avoid disadvantages. Other voluntary services & activities are not regulated by law.

7.2 Perspectives for the creation of a voluntary civic service in countries where it does not exist

There is a voluntary civic service in Germany.

9.2 Recent (this year) measures to remove obstacles to young people#s volunteering

The committee on financial issues of the German Federal Parliament decided to add another million # to the existing budget for voluntary services in the Child and Youth Plan of the Federation in 2007. This money aims especially at the stronger involvement of disadvantaged young people in voluntary services. With this a decision of the Federal German Parliament was implemented which asks for the improvement of the general framework for voluntary services. The programme #Generationsuebergreifende Freiwilligendienste# (Voluntary services embracing all age groups, period 2005-2008) to translate the recommendations of the committee #Impulse fuer die Zivilgesellschaft # Perspektiven fuer Freiwilligendienste und Zivildienst in Deutschland" into action kept going in 2006. In 2006 several campaigns aiming at the recognition of voluntary activities took place. More info: www.engagement-macht-stark.de

The 96th Day of the German Catholic Church (Deutscher Katholikentag) 2006 took place in Saarbruecken, May 24th #28th. Round about 1400 volunteers were needed. Volunteers from foreign countries with good knowledge of German were also welcome. The volunteers got lodging & food for free & a reimbursement of travel costs (in Germany). The minium age was 18 years or 16 years, if the person was part of a group with a leader over 18 & had a permission of the parents (www.katholikentag.de). Next event scheduled for May, 21st # 25th 2008 in Osnabrück. 50000 applicants put their names forward for the 2006 FIFA World CupTM Volunteer Programme. The #Ready, willing and able# team comprised a total of 15000 volunteers, who were seeing to the needs of guests, teams and journalists during the summer of 2006. One in three volunteers # around 5300 in total # was working directly looking after fans and guests. After the tournament, efforts were recognised with a diploma
