The legal status for volunteers is established in Lei n.º 71/98 de 3 de Novembro and Decreto Lei 389/99 de 30 de Setembro)

5.2 How are volunteers and volunteer organisations taxed? Are they conceded tax exemption?

In Portugal a person's tax status depends on the nature of the activity and of his/her relationship with the organization for whom they volunteer. As long as a "volunteer" and "volunteer organisation" relationship is maintained in accordance with the law, no employment relationship will exist between them so there is no obligation of social security contributions or taxes.

5.3 Describe if volunteers are protected by social or health insurance, or if their activities are recognised by the pension system.

Yes. The law established a social insurance if required by the volunteer and the organization.

5.4 Legal situation of unemployed young people participating in voluntary activities

There is no discrimination in the law regarding this subject.

The IPJ has a main programme in partnership with other public and private organizations whose main purpose is to prevent fire and protect nature; it's the project "*Voluntariado para a Floresta*". Apart from this, the IPJ is putting its experience for promoting volunteering projects, selecting, training and managing groups of young volunteers for public and private organisations willing to develop joint projects.

The IPJ has done several partnerships with different organizations to promote voluntary activities (i.e. "Voluntariado para as Florestas" and "SNS Jovem - Young volunteers in the national health system") and also voluntary projects in different areas like sport, culture and leisure activities (Gymnestrada 2003, to Euro 2004, to UEFA CUP 2005 among others). This kind of projects developed among public opinion a different perception of voluntary role in society.
