




## **EU YOUTH STRATEGY (2010-2018)**

## **Overall objectives:**

- To create more and equal opportunities for all young people in education and on the labour market
- 2. To promote active citizenship, social inclusion and solidarity of all young people





#### **THE EU YOUTH REPORT 2012**

- Places the EU Youth Strategy firmly within EUROPE 2020
- Emphasises the cross-sectoral nature of youth policy
- Documents that the EU Youth Strategy has an important impact and added value
- Shows that the crisis has a heavy impact on youth
- Proposes social inclusion and health & well-being as priorities for the coming three years



#### **PROPOSING FUTURE PRIORITIES**

More focus on challenges facing young people as a result of the crisis:

- Employment and entrepreneurship
- Social inclusion, health and well-being

#### VALIDATION OF NFIL IN THE EU

- Benefits for the individual (economic, educational, personal)
- Benefits for the society (better skilled population)
- Benefits for the economy



#### **CURRENT SHORTCOMINGS IN VALIDATION**

- Only a limited number of Member States has comprehensive systems for the validation of NFIL (FI, FR, LU, NL, PT)
- Validation opportunities are underused in the majority of Member States (skills remain invisible)
- Lack of coherence and transparency between validation systems of Member States
- Current European tools and instruments have important weaknesses (scope, political status etc)



## RECOMMENDATION MEMBER STATES

**(I)** 

- By 2015: National **systems** for validation of NFIL:
  - Opportunities for citizens to validate their knowledge, skills and competences acquired through NFIL
  - Opportunities to obtain a full or partial qualification on the basis of learning outcomes, no matter how they were acquired (formal, nonformal and informal learning)
- Validation systems should include:
  - Support for identification of learning outcomes
  - Documentation of learning outcomes
  - Assessment of an individual's learning outcomes
  - Certification of learning outcomes (e.g. credits or a full qualification)





### RECOMMENDATION MEMBER STATES

- National systems to respect the following principles:
  - Be a coherent and integral part of the NQF
  - Information on validation opportunities to be widely available
  - Specific targeting of disadvantaged groups
  - Individuals in unemployment or unsecure employment: opportunity to undergo an audit of their skills and competences
  - Access to validation to be affordable
  - **Guidance** and counselling to be available and affordable
  - Transparent quality assurance measures
  - Professional development of staff involved in validation
  - For qualifications obtained on the basis of NFIL: same or equivalent standards as for qualifications obtained through formal programmes
  - Use of **Europass** framework tools
  - Synergies with credit systems (e.g. ECTS, ECVET)





# RECOMMENDATIONS TO MEMBER STATES(III)

- Ensure the involvement of all relevant stakeholders in the development and implementation of validation systems
- Incentives to employers, youth organisations and civil society organisations to facilitate the documentation of learning outcomes by using relevant tools
- Incentives to E&T providers to facilitate access to further learning and to award exemptions/credits for NFIL
- Ensure coordination between education, training, employment and youth implementation services and relevant policies





- Facilitating peer learning and exchange of good practice
- Regular updating the European Guidelines for validation
- Further developing Europass tools on non-formal and informal learning experiences
- Support through the future Education, Training, Youth and Sports programmes and the Structural Funds (ESF)
- Evaluate and report to the Council by 31 July 2017
