## Palestine: Civil Society Program

#### Projects:

- Human Capacity Assessment with Higher Council of Youth and Sports and Civil Society in December 2013
- Workshop "Youth and Advocacy" with Program Partner Palestinian Non Governmental Organizations' Network(PNGO) in December 2013
- 2 Development Advisors seconded to Programm partners Sharek Youth Forum and PCMR to analyze youth policies and foster youth employability



## **Tunesia: Local Youth Participation**

- CoMun's approach involves municipalities and civil society organizations. The interventions aim at creating a climate of trust and collaboration among them.
- An idea contest on youth participation microprojects has been launched by municipalities among civil society organizations. The purpose was to provide young people with a hands -on learning opportunity to take local action.
- Capacity building measures were taken in order to strengthen municipalities and local youth organizations throughout this process.
- Institutionalization of trained local youth officers and training of local youth promoters
- Creation and implementation of local youth action plans








## Morocco: strengthening the civil dialogue

- The objective of CoMun's component Citizen Dialogue is to facilitate the formalization of a sustained dialogue between the municipality and the civil society.
- envisages the establishment of citizen's participation in Morocco.
- It focuses mainly on the participation of youth and women in urban development through coaching and supporting initiatives of citizens
- provides instruments in order to establish a network for the exchange of methods and procedures for the promotion of citizen's participation.
- Common interest groups and civil society actors, including youth groups, are jointly implementing initiatives.
- Youth groups are able to formulate their position in relation to urban subjects.



## **Egypt: New Spaces for pol. participation**

- "New Spaces for Civic Engagement and Political Participation" aims to establish a dialogue between young people, the civil society and goverment representatives using youth centers as a platform
- 16 Youth Centers are being renovated to serve as platforms for democratic dialogue
- Young Civil society representatives receive peer to peer training in the areas of political participation and peaceful conflict resolution





## **Yemen: Youth Participation**

#### Project:

Based on a project on youth empowerment the follow up project focusses on institutionalised political participation for the youth in the cities of Sana'a and Aden. In cooperation with GIZ a local NGO develops options for political participation and prepares the youth to play a role and to set up councils.

#### Expected Results:

- Setting up of youth councils on local level
- Institutionalised participation of youth in the pilot areas of Sana'a and Aden
- Role out into the remaining governorates after successful implementation of pilots





#### Social Integration of Youth in the MENA-Region

- Time frame: 2013-2014;
- Participating Countries: Tunesia, OPT, Morocco, Egypt, Yemen
- Thematic Focus: Participation, Promotion
- Goal: Development and dissemination of innovative approaches for the social integration of youth in the MENA region



#### **Measures offered to youth professionals:**

- virtual exchange platform for practitioners engaged in youth social work including:
  - A forum for expert exchange and peer learning
  - A blended learning tool to assist training measures by the partners involved
  - visualisation of youth promotion structures and approaches and presentation of standards and good practices
  - Documentation of training experience
  - Accompanied by cross-border face-to-face exchanges between participants on the projects' training courses.



### Measures offered to young people

Setting-up of a Virtual Youth Center, including:

- web-based campaigns on social and political participation of youth
- 'creative spaces' inviting young people to post texts, images, videos etc. on topics related to social and political participation of youth.
- virtual competitions
- live chats etc.
