Setting up youth participation structures

Setting up youth participation structures

- Started during the process
- Still continues today
- Adapted to the needs of the city and its young people



Young people as policy makers

- Cross-sectoral: young people can co-decide in all municipal desicion processes and decisions
- Ensures that municipal decisions are more connected with realities of young people
- Tailoring youth policies and youth work to the needs of young people



Budgeting for youth

- Young people co-decide on the allocation of parts of the municipal budget
- "One of the most innovative mechanisms of youth participation."
- Young people become more aware of their rights and responsabilities as citizens



Developing spaces for young people

- Clearly understanding the needs of young people and developing spaces for and with young people
- Creating new (Novi Sad, Maribor) or renovating existing spaces (Torino, industrial spaces into youth spaces)



- More than 10,000 volunteers in various projects in the Capitals throughout the implementation year



Number of volunteers engaged in European Youth Capitals7









Increased funding opportunities


