LGBT youth in the Netherlands


- Sexual orientation -> sexual identity
- Dutch LGB teenagers still face deficiencies in <u>various areas</u>; can have a significant influence on their <u>wellbeing</u>.

'Sexual diversity in sports'


Quantitative (online questionnaires)

- homo/bisexual self-identified men (n=281) and women (n=193)
- Sport participants, Dutch population


15+ (n=1.110)




'In competitive club sport, male homosexuality is still a big taboo', by gender and sexuality, in % (totally) agree



Sports participation, by gender and sexuality (%)



'In my sport group it is not uncommon that jokes or remarks are made about homosexuals', Dutch population active within a sports group 15-70 year (n=847), in % (totally) agree



Qualitative (ethnographical: logbook reports)

- Active male team members from 'mainstream' sports clubs
- 7 heterosexuals / 4 homosexuals
- Between 15-25 years old
- 130 observations within 6 different team sports: handball (1), baseball (1), hockey (1), netball (1) (elite), rugby (1), football (5).

'Sporting culture'

- "The trainer enters, with the words: 'OK you queers"
- "Look at the way you chase the ball, what a queer!"
- •"'Are you off to the shower Hessel? Then I'll wait a bit.' Laughing, and then 'Ha ha, no, I actually enjoy being in the shower with you ... pick up the shampoo bottle will you?'"

Borderline cases on the (pink) edge

- Failing/ weakling/ give up
- "When an opponent lay on the ground after being fouled, players said: 'Come on fag, get up."
- Interpretation: "you queer"
- Discourage/ punish, despite 'sporting culture'?!

Serious questions and discussions

"I can sometimes break the ice with a witty comment if it's about my homosexuality, but sometimes I have my doubts about what I can and cannot say. What they consider totally unacceptable is when I start talking about how attractive a certain man is. I need to hold myself in check sometimes so that I don't react too quickly when they start talking about women in macho terms. It's at times like these that I feel like making a comment about men, but I think better of it."

"If you just act normally..."

- "He's become such a gay boy, really dirty, bah"
- Powerlessness
- "What's the difference between a chef and a queer? They both stir around in yesterday's meal."
- Affect personally, fear
- 'Are you going to the a gay bar tonight?'
 Getting fucked in the arse!'

Summary

- Male team sports can no longer be characterised as absolutely homophobic
- Queer = nickname
- Homophobia -> homonegativity
- Reproduction of gender- and heteronormativity in sport



Policy to increase awareness-raising with respect to LGBT acceptance and combating homonegativity and hetero- and gender-normativity in sport.

- NOC*NSF "What can I do?"
- 1. Set a good example
- 2. Adopt LGBT in club-policy/ guidelines
- 3. Carry it out
- 4. Correct others





Elite sports

Different?

- Sport environment more important
- Quitting -> hiding

Public personality/ sports celebrity





Elite sports



Educate:

- The KNVB offers a training package for stewards involved in Dutch professional football organisations.
- Certification criteria for youth training courses in professional football clubs

Inform:

- Developing and offering a workshop on promoting the acceptance of homosexuality in professional football clubs.
- Explicitly on the agenda of all existing meetings with <u>supporters' associations</u> and supporters' coordinators of professional football clubs.

Support:

 Appointing a <u>confidential advisor</u> to all the KNVB district offices and at the headquarters in Zeist to support amateur and professional football clubs on the issue of the acceptance of homosexuality.

Maintain:

- The KNVB is refining the "<u>Guideline</u> for tackling verbal violence" with regard to the acceptance of homosexuality. The guideline will be refined to indicate that the KNVB will not accept any offensive or insulting <u>crowd chants</u> based on sexual preference, any more than it accepts other types of insulting or offensive crowd chants.
- KNVB examines whether the acceptance of homosexuality can be explicitly included in the KNVB <u>standard terms</u> and conditions for professional football.
