1.	Project of the Primary School "Ali Podrimja"	<u>City</u> : Bajram Curri
	All together for a friendly school	Beneficiary: Albania

Specific project's objectives:

- To improve the relationships of parents, teachers, pupils and community so that each student can develop its potential;
- To increase the level of awareness among local authorities about the problems plaguing the school;
- To increase the involvement of all pupils in activities that enhance their school performance and improve their development, especially of those who face social problems, have learning difficulties

Project's main activities:

Awareness campaign:

- Three Roundtables will gather 75 participants teachers, pupils, parents and community members to discuss challenges and problems in efforts to create a friendlier and more inclusive school, effective joint solutions and potential resources.
- Local TV will broadcast presentation of project and its activities;
- School newspaper (100 copies) will be issued every two months, sharing information on inclusion and improvements toward more inclusive school. The first edition will inform the project's participants how to contribute to its successful implementation.
- Choosing the best essay on theme "How I understand inclusion", written by the pupils of upper grades. This will be followed by discussions on inclusion and what should teachers, parents and pupils do to ensure a welcoming and inclusive school.
- Exhibition of paintings and drawings on inclusion will include all pupils. This is an opportunity for all those who might find it difficult to express their ideas, beliefs and expectations through an essay.

Capacity building:

- Three one-day trainings 30 teachers, 30 parents and 30 pupils will discuss on inclusion in class, family and school;
- Open Classes on theme "How do teachers realize inclusion in class" at all school levels. Teachers and parents will discuss strengths and
 effectiveness of inclusive teaching methods, practices and give recommendations for improvement.
- Peer learning activity: 5 teachers, 5 parents and community members and 5 pupils will exchange experience with "Lef Sallata" primary

school in Vlora. They will develop a plan of cooperation for improving positive inclusive practices, especially for providing support to children with learning difficulties, disabilities or any kind of social and economic problems.

- **Creating inclusive school environment**, especially for children with learning difficulties, social or economic problems, by:
- Enriching the school library with 200 books, with arrangement and extending working hours after school;
- Equipping multifunctional hall with musical instruments and painting tools for recreation, therapy purpose and talent development. All children can use it during or even after school, with the support of teachers and parents;
- Forming sports teams (football, volleyball, basketball, and gymnastics) and providing technical and material support for the development of after school activities. These teams will encourage participation of vulnerable children.
- Organising entertaining activities for specific events with involving all pupils, teachers, parents and community members.
- Let's celebrate together Our School's Day- 19 November
- International Day of Children's Rights 20 November;
- Olympic Day at school with the participation of all pupils in all organized activities;
- Children's Festival with songs and drama/plays related to exclusion and inclusion in school and community;
- The stylist and fashion designer': pupils design, sew 21 skirts for different school's artistic groups.

Environmental activities:

- Working meeting The Right for a Clean and Healthy Environment will gather all stakeholders in joint efforts, solutions;
- Workshop A clean environment educates children with love for Nature, Earth and everything that surrounds them;
- Planting trees in the school yard and beyond joint action of stakeholders, with the trees ensured by community partners.

Our culture, our identity, diversity and behaviour:

- Older pupils will identify aspects of culture influencing our behaviour and lack of understanding, by filling the form on culture
- Pupils will present themselves through drawings "I am", which will be exhibited in the school hallways.
- Closure of the project: Celebration and ceremonial presentation of the project with display of recorded moments: project activities, reflections, lessons learned, evaluations and recommendations for improvement of work in the future.

Direct beneficiaries: 499 pupils (6-16 year old), 28 teachers, parents;

Indirect beneficiaries: school, community, future generations and pupils of other schools.

Specific project's objectives:

- To increase the awareness level on inclusion and integration;
- To improve the educational and social level of the pupils with special needs;
- To improve management's and teachers' abilities for inclusion of all marginalized groups;
- To improve involvement and integration of all marginalized groups in school activities;
- To improve active participation of parents in decision making process in school regarding inclusion;
- To improve and adapt the outdoor school environment

Project's main activities:

❖ Awareness campaign:

- Round table on THE project, for all stakeholders, indirect and direct beneficeries;
- Three TV spots on the project will be broadcasted within three months on TV station of Vlora city (one per month)
- Preparation and distribution of 2000 leaflets and two banners for the visibility of the project;
- Workshop with the Pupils' Government, on the project and inclusion;
- Sharing workshop experiences with other pupils through meetings in each classroom;
- They will discuss inclusion issues, how can pupils contribute to a friendly, welcoming and inclusive school, in cooperation with teachers and parents;

Capacity building:

- Training pedagogical staff on:
- Neurological disorders, autistic, dyslexia, hyperactive, language disorder treatment;
- Two trainings on evaluation, creation of PEI and education;
- Two trainings on difficulties in learning, evaluation, Individual Educational Plan and education;

- Two trainings on communication and treatment of children with behaviour disorders and social equality
- Two trainings for parents of children with special needs on:
 - Communication, knowing their needs in the family living conditions as continuation of the work of teachers in school
- Professional Support to pupils with disabilities:
- Establishing initial evaluation team of a neurologist, a psychologist, teachers and parents;
- Identifying pupils with disabilities and completing files for each of them;
- Preparing and implementing Individual Educational Plans, developed by educators and parents;
- Final Evaluation results at the end of the school year.

Peer learning activity:

- Exchanging experience with the primary school "Ali Podrimja", in Tropoja.
- Drafting a cooperation plan with a group of teachers, parents and pupils of this school improving positive inclusive practices and development of a more inclusive school.

Comprehensive and entertaining activities for events such as:

- International Day of Children's Rights, November 20: Artistic program on inclusion
- International Day of Children with Disabilities: pupils produce and distribute leaflets and banners

Improvement of outdoor school environment:

- Improving sports ground
- Providing sports equipment necessary for the movement's therapy for all the children, but especially for children with special needs (Swiss balls, Dynamic and Balance, Climbing Equipment).
- Project closing activity, sharing results with all the stakeholders and planning future activities, continuing the work.

4. Project of the General Secondary School Gjimnazi "Ismail Qemali"

City: Tirana

Beneficiary: Albania

Cooperation among pupils, parents and teachers produces success for school, family and community and prevents violence and conflicts

Specific project's objectives:

- To improve parent-teacher-student communication and cooperation for a more inclusive school;
- To increase awareness and active involvement of parents, teachers, pupils, local government in the school life, especially of parents and pupils at higher risk of marginalization and exclusion;
- To create a friendly and welcoming school climate.

Project's main activities:

Awareness campaign

- Two workshops on the project and inclusion with 70 participants: teachers, parents, pupils, local authorities and Tirana Education directory.
- 1500 leaflets on the project distributed to, families, community and school.
- Posters on parental involvement, parent-teacher-student cooperation and an inclusive school- made and distributed by pupils;
- School newspaper will be issued every three months by pupils, with the support of teachers and parents. It will reflect issues of high interest for pupils, parents and teachers. Newspaper will inform on project activities and free inclusion initiatives as well;
- School website will update information on project activities and progress toward a more inclusive school.

Capacity building:

Training teachers and parents on effective communication techniques and methods of parental involvement in school. Special
attention will be given to the parents of pupils at higher risk of marginalization. This activity will improve communication and
cooperation among pupils, parents and teachers.

Activities for friendlier and welcoming school environment

The consultation process on school regulations and curricula will consist of:

- Meetings and discussions with all the stakeholders: parents, pupils, teachers and others;
- Distributing documents on internal regulation and a summary of the school curricula to parents, pupils, teachers and other community members, by e-mail or in hard copy
- Collecting ideas, suggestions and recommendations for improved version of documents
- The new regulation will be displayed in the main school premises and on the school website.

Awareness and advocacy campaign against bulling:

The aim of this campaign is to create a friendlier and welcoming school, where everyone feels safe and respected. It is expected to improve communication, prevent and resolve conflicts. The participants of the campaign will be: the Pupils Government, Parent Council, as well as teachers, other pupils, parents and community members.

Activities of this campaign will be:

- Round table on diversity, violence, conflicts, bullying and effective ways of preventing and treating anti-social behaviour. Parents, teachers and pupils will take part in the round table.
- Training Pupils' Government and other pupils on effective communication and conflict resolution techniques
- Developing an action plan for improving communication, treatment, mitigation and resolution of conflicts of pupils or between pupils and other stakeholders
- Preparation and exposure of posters by pupils with the theme: "Violence is not the solution to a problem";
- Artistic Activity with theatrical parts (role playing), musical, humoristic sketches, on the themes of violence and inclusion;
- Art exhibition "Born in this way": all pupils are invited to express their ideas and thoughts on bullying and acceptance of oneself and others as they are. They will exhibit paintings, photographs, writings and poems.
- Surveys at the end of project to measure the achieved progress toward set project's objectives

Project's target groups:

Direct beneficiaries: 262 vulnerable children with learning difficulties, economic problems, one parent or divorced parents, coming from rural areas, the other 1538 pupils, parents of all pupils, 72 teachers and school administrators.

Indirect beneficiaries: the school, the community, Tirana Education Directory, Ministry of Education and Sports, Society.

5. Project of the General Secondary School "Muharrem Çollaku" Inclusion, the new philosophy of our school City: Pogradec Beneficiary: Albania

Specific project's objectives:

- To raise awareness of teachers, parents, pupils and community on the inclusion, on the project and on the importance of their active involvement for its successful realization;
- To improve communication and relationships of parents, teachers and pupils in order to successfully solve their problems;
- To create a better school environment with new opportunities that encourage and support inclusion and development of pupils with disabilities, social and learning difficulties, at risk of marginalization and exclusion, as well of other pupils.

Project's main activities:

Awareness Campaign:

- Two Awareness Meetings with various stakeholders regarding the initiative to make school be a centre of Inclusive Education;
- *A "Local TV Studio Discussion"* with representatives from the School and Teacher Net, Parent's Council, School Board, Pupils Government and Local Government on inclusive education, problems and challenges in schools and project initiative;
- Preparation and distribution of 1500 leaflets in various public places of the community by Student Government and other pupils wearing T-shirts with the logo of the project of inclusion;
- Promotional spot on the essence of inclusion and importance of involvement of all stakeholders, broadcasted on local TV;
- Establishment of special project corner and setting a monitor at the school entrance for providing information necessary for the project to all stakeholders.

❖ Improvement of school environment:

- Construction of four ramps at the entrance of the schoolyard, the school building and of the gym,
- Appointment of a person responsible for providing assistance to pupils and other persons with mobility difficulties;
- Preparation of a multifunctional room and its equipment with chess, tennis tables and painting angels, etc.;
- Decoration and rearrangement of classrooms and school corridor so that they create a feeling of welcoming and inclusive school;

❖ Increasing the capacity of teachers, parents and pupils by:

- Training of teachers on inclusion, especially to communication and involvement of the children with disabilities and their parents,

besides other pupils and parents;

- Establishing Inclusion Support Team (IST), consisting of 5 teachers, 5 parents and 5 pupils;
- Training Inclusion Support Team on recognition and treatment of various inclusion-related problems;
- Three workshops with parents on importance of communication, diversity issues and inclusion, organised by IST;
- Identifying problems of parents in cooperation and coordination with the Local Government at the workshops. The aim is to provide socio-economic support to the target group of parents and children with these problems (economic aid, employment...);
- Engaging two student to support pupils in need, in the classroom of the Pupils' Councils; ;
- Pupils Government will share information with others after training "Understanding, respecting and appreciating Diversity";
- Painting a mural on one of the main walls of the school hall, on theme "An Inclusive School".

Peer Learning or exchange of experience with other local schools:

- Workshop with teachers and school leaders: Nine local primary schools will encourage the promotion and development of positive inclusion practices at other levels of pre-university education system;
- Workshop of the "Inclusion Support Team" (IST) at the high school of Çerrave in Pogradec district

• Organization of highly inclusive activities (for pupils, parents, teachers):

- The Week of Inclusion in Education: exhibition of pupils' drawings, paintings, handcrafts and photos;
- The Day of Poetry and Drama with the theme of diversity and inclusion;
- Sports day with football, volleyball, basketball, chess and tennis games;
- A very large activity on promoting the values and cultural traditions of the community

Ceremony closure of the project

All the participants of the project and representatives of project beneficiaries will share challenges and problems faced, lessons learned, progress achieved within the projects and future steps. These themes will mark class-based discussions, presentation of the main project moments and school and community-based forum with more than 70 participants

Project's target groups:

Direct beneficiaries: 350 pupils with disabilities, learning difficulties, social and economic problems, children of immigrants, 120 parents, 457 other pupils, 40 teachers and school administrators of our school and 30 teachers and school administrators of other schools of the district, Class and School Parent Councils and Student Government representatives.

Identifying student groups to be involved in the project and assessing their needs:

- Preparing a selection criteria form for the target groups;
- Creating a database information on pupils belonging to the target group by the head teacher
- Questionnaires, focus groups, interviews to assess the needs of the target group;
- Preparing survey form to assess the level of acceptance and attitudes towards pupils with special needs by other pupils;

- Training of teachers on inclusion and guidelines for Individual Educational Plan;
- Training of school team: multiple intelligence and application of participatory methods in Professional Education;
- Internal training: the head teacher and her/his role in the inclusion process;
- Training of the Board and the Council of Parents: their role and participation in improving school inclusive policies;
- Training parents of targeted group of pupils in the age of adolescence on characteristics of an inclusive parent;
- Training of Student Government: "Different but equal"

Improvement of infrastructure for the implementation of inclusive practices:

- Adjusting the hall for inclusive activities
- Adaptation of sports environment: underlying iron in the wall, Swedish scale, the rubberized floor carpet;
- Preparation and enrichment of the project table/board with information and photos of the project activities

Project's main activities:

Awareness campaign:

- Preparation and distribution of leaflets on what the school offers to pupils and the community;
- Articles in the newspapers and promotional spots on the local TV;
- Informing and awareness-raising visits to the families;
- Presentations on the school and its offers by the group of teachers working in the primary schools of the district;
- Open day with the participation of parents, pupils, teachers, 9th-grade pupils of the primary schools of the district, Regional Education
 Directorate and business representatives and other members of community;
- Workshop with all the actors to discuss how to make school more open to the community, to be effective and inclusive;

Creating a pleasant and welcoming school environment:

- Painting the outer school façade;
- Reconstruction/improvement of sanitary conditions for girls;

Capacity building - qualification of teachers

Three-day training of two groups of 15 teachers on:

- Student-centred-teaching methods "Mutual communication, the positive discipline"
- Development of psycho-social skills as cross curricular skills;
- Differentiated teaching;
- Bases of didactics in vocational schools (hidden drop out);
- Organisation of Open Classes where colleagues share their knowledge, skills,
- Inclusive methods and practices and provide their inputs for further improvements

❖ Additional/differentiated working with pupils with learning difficulties:

- Preparation of a plan of additional support classes;
- The realisation of additional support classes throughout the year;

❖ Peer learning: Teacher-teacher experience exchange

- Exchanging experience on inclusion with "Shtjefen Gjeçovi" school, in Pristine, whose programs are sponsored by GIZ-KOSOVO (a group of 15 teachers);
- Sharing the experience gained in Kosovo to other teachers of the school and primary schools of the District, at the workshop

! Learning through projects and initiatives to support pupils with economic difficulties:

- The placement of bins to separate waste;
- Building a drop hammer for pressing metal;
- The collection and sale of these materials;
- The usage of gained funds for pupils who drop out of school for economic reasons, to cover costs of transport, books, etc.
- Adding greener areas, improving the green area of the front yard school with plants.

The improvement of psycho-social support:

- Creating proper environment for the psychological service to girls and pupils who are at risk of marginalization and exclusion;
- Meetings and consultations with pupils;
- workshops with pupils, teachers and parents for the adolescence, parenting etc.;

***** Business-school-family collaboration:

- Five workshops with business-parents-pupils-teachers for creating a stronger collaboration between them;
- Meetings and consultations with business representatives to ensure a job after finishing the first level for pupils who drop out of school.

Project's target groups:

Direct beneficiaries: 130 pupils with learning and socio-economic difficulties, 1087 other pupils (all boys), 20 girls that will become an important part of the school, 50 parents and 25 business representatives participating in workshops, 60 teachers and school administrators.

Indirect beneficiaries: all parents, the entire school and other schools of the district, the whole community, the local government, Regional Education Directorate (RED) and the business.

8. Project of the Primary school "Mustafa Ejubović - Šejh Jujo" Education for quality teaching City: Mostar Beneficiary: Bosnia and Herzegovina

Specific project's objectives:

- Improving teachers' competences for teaching pupils with special needs and abilities of class and subject teaching through organization of teacher trainings and establishing cooperation with relevant stakeholders from the field of inclusive education
- Improving quality of the teaching process by equipping the multimedia classroom
- Improving cohesion among pupils through organization of peer support in learning and workshops on sensitization about diversities
- Improving cooperation of teachers, professional assistants, parents and pupils in providing support to pupils with special needs and abilities in regular classes

Project's main activities:

The team of trainers will organize workshops for all pupils and their parents to help them to provide support to pupils with special needs in their everyday school activities. Different experts from the field of inclusive education will be involved: from the Centre for Children and Youth with Special Needs Los Rosales, Pedagogical Institute Mostar, professors at Teaching Faculty and other professionals.

Closure of the project and sharing knowledge:

After the completion of the project, the team of trainers will use multimedia classroom to educate a few teachers from other schools in the City of Mostar That would be the way of networking schools in the city Mostar and Herzegovina Neretva Canton on topics:

- Identifying pupils with special needs;

- > Developing individual educational plans for pupils with special needs.

Nine one-hour talk shows on Radio Prnjavor with School's journalism section will discuss on:

- status of children and youth with developmental disabilities in local community,
- types and characteristics of difficulties in mental and physical development,
- aims of the project, project's activities together with statements of children with difficulties in mental and physical development, peer educators, teaching staff, mediators of workshops and trainings

Adapting a premise for work with developmentally disabled children and their stay:

Teachers, dialectologist and personal assistants will use this premise for work and stay of children with difficulties in mental and physical development. Pupils will be able to stay here when they are absent from classes for various reasons, such as lack of obligation to attend a class due to difficulties in development. It would be also used for trainings of professional staff, school section's work and individual meetings of teachers and parents. The adaption of premise according to pedagogical standards and needs of the pupils implies:

- Construction of stair lift for wheelchairs, shelf, desk, chairs, audio and video equipment, didactical resources and similar.
- Members of art section will paint the room in order to make the premise as comfortable as possible.

Capacity building

• Improving the competence of teaching staff and professional associate

Organising four interactive educational workshops with 20 participants each with following themes

- Improving the position of pupils with difficulties in mental and physical development;
- Diagnosis and treatment of difficulties in mental and physical development from the area of defectology;
- Diagnosis and treatment of difficulties in mental and physical development from the area of speech-language pathology;
- Improving the quality of education at pupils with difficulties in mental and physical development.

All participants of the workshop will write an expert paper "Example of good practice" during the school year 2014/15. All the papers will be unified and printed in brochure.

Activities on theme "Acceptance of differences"

- Training of pedagogues and psychologists trainers for peer educators. Continuous education of pedagogues and psychologists working in a schools leads to long-term improvement of student's relationships and general social climate.
- **Training of Peer educators** sixteen pupils, from seven to nine classes, who expressed interest to improve their knowledge and abilities and become peer educators.
- Thirty four workshops for improving relationship among pupils. Peer educators will realize workshops on acceptance of difference in all classes in the school.
- Three mutual workshops with protégés of the Day Care Centre for children with developmental disabilities "Neven".
- Project's closure: Presentation of project's results for participants, parents, representatives from other schools and local community will be organised in Public institution "Centre for Culture" Prnjavor.

The workshops will improve the teachers' work with pupils from vulnerable groups, improve communication and cooperation of school and parents and increase the level of pupils' participation in the school life.

- to use different didactic materials,

Specific project's objectives:

- To improve the quality of work with pupils with special needs in regular classes through teacher training and purchasing needed didactic and teaching material
- To improve interpersonal communication among pupils and pupils and teachers
- To promote vocational programs through improvement of practical training in the school workshop for the first year car mechanics, technicians for electric power and the first, second and third year locksmiths

Project's main activities:

❖ Four lectures for teachers working with pupils with special needs

 Teachers will improve knowledge on various difficulties pupils may have in learning and how to adjust and individualize existing curricula.

Workshops on interpersonal communication:

- Pupils who come from families in which no member of the family work, often do not have enough self-confidence and withdraw into themselves and other people are excluding them from school and social life. The same thing is with pupils who have difficult situation in the family, or do not succeed in school, become frustrated and do not know how to deal with problems, and incorrectly solve the stress. These pupils often have conflicts with their teachers, the other pupils as well as with their parents. We want to include them into workshops with teachers on the topic "Improvement of interpersonal communication through experiential learning". We want for them to learn to stand up for themselves and not hurt the others. Workshops will be led by professional trainer (educator and psychologist) and they will be organized for pupils, teachers and parents who show the interest (15 participants per workshop). We hope thereby to improve communication in the teaching process, raise self-esteem, which should result in greater motivation for learning and school attendance.
- **Purchasing didactic and teaching materials and professional literature:**

- for the work of teachers
- for pupils to understand better the teaching material
- for the school pedagogue who is providing all necessary support to teachers, pupils and parents,
- For the work of three pupils who came up with the idea to include pupils with special needs in the section that they lead themselves. They will help them with homework, studying and having a good time together. School will support this kind of work so that other pupils may join and help as well.

Renovating and equipping the locksmith's workshop

- Equipping the new school workshop with tools and materials necessary for conducting practical classes in school.

• The student's production of new tools and objects

 Pupils will be able to make metal and wired didactic materials, geometric shapes and bodies, as part of practical work in the locksmith's workshop. This will be useful in teaching mathematics and physics, too, while the products could be sold on the market.

• Field trips with pupils as part of the practical work

A field trip to Novi Travnik

This trip is also planned for pupils where they would visit the factory of metal structures. In that way they will have an opportunity to expand their knowledge and socialize more outside the school.

Stop peer violence campaign

Appropriate themes will be chosen, date determined, while required material, working place and catering provided.

Hiring two RE assistants by the recommendation of Roma NGOs

Assistants will work according to designed working programme with a formed group of pupils for additional, remedial classes.

❖ A school informer and promotional materials (posters) will promote the project, new school's logo and motto which will reflect understanding and commitment to specific inclusive values.

❖ Inclusion Week - Universal Children's Day, November 20:

- Contest "My school inclusive school": the best essays, paintings and photographs, in each category two authors will receive diplomas
 and rewards. Reward for the first prize is a tablet computer and a camera for the second prize. A jury consisted of three members will

So far, pupils were not aware of Pupils Parliament's role and its activities. This will change elections for the Pupils Parliament, inaugural session of the Parliament will to be attended by teachers, representatives of parents and the local community. School radio station will cover all these activities, as well as the work of the Parliament and all the actions it implements.

- ❖ Peer learning and exchange of experience: 10 teachers and 15 pupils will visit the Fourth Gymnasium in Sarajevo. The pupils will stay with host families. Pupils will learn about the programmes of Gymnasium: Active Young People and Pupils Exchange Programme with Germany. The pupils and teachers will spread the ideas and values of inclusive education of their school in Pljevlja. Both schools will exchange innovative ideas and put into practice. The pupils from both schools will make a short film *We value and embrace diversity*.
- School play with the aim of raising funds for school will serve as a role model for future fundraising actions. Teachers, parents and pupils will prepare and perform a school play, collecting money through selling the tickets for the play.

Pedagogical assistants and teachers will bring leaflets on the project and activities to Roma families. • Twelve creative workshops for children from deprived environments

Improving the professional competence of the employees

Five members of school team, 24 parents and 6 members of non-teaching staff will attend this training. Trainer will be Ms Veselinka Milović, PhD, Clinical Psychologist, Faculty of Philosophy, Department of Psychology, Nikšić.
- In-service trainings for 30 teachers, accredited by the Institute for improvement of education:
 - A talented child in school what should we do with them
 - Individualization and differentiation as a model of teaching practice

After the trainings, the principal and school team will decide who among the teachers would best be suited to inform and educate other employees about the main training conclusion

\$ Equipping a cabinet for natural sciences: chemistry, physics and biology.

Equipped cabinet will make teaching be more inclusive. Direct beneficiaries would be pupils exposed to the risk of marginalization,

both those with low pre-knowledge and those talented. Teaching in this improved and adjusted environment will enable manual working of low grade pupils and group and differentiated work. The fact that pupils will be properly occupied will prevent conflicts among pupils. Talented pupils will have the opportunity to improve further their knowledge and skills and also to help low grade pupils (peer-to-peer learning).

Implementing knowledge in formed pupils groups

- School Company: Pupils of various knowledge, motivation and interest, will apply their theoretical knowledge and produce soaps, crèmes, powders and candles and sell them to other pupils, teachers and parents.

Class community lesson

The pupils will disseminate experiences from "Inclusive Classroom". While sharing with others, they will open door for friendships, enable other pupils to recognize themselves in somebody who is not like them. The goal is for them to understand the diversity as an art of different thinking.

Workshops for pupils

Workshops will be the result of pupils' ideas and suggestions. They will perform workshops transparently and openly, in the school yard or in the centre of the town. All pupils and all citizens are invited to take part.

The messages of these workshops are:

- Respect each other
- Give your hand to everybody who needs it
- Freedom to the scared

Workshops will contribute to pupils to become more open to freely discuss dislikes and barriers with their teachers, to be beyond prejudice and stereotypes. That will give a great contribution to democracy and individuality development.

For several days, they will attend activities of other school and share these practices with pupils and teachers of their school.

- Games Without Frontiers will include about 250 pupils from second to fifth grade and 15 teachers. There are no winners in the games, jJust fun and multicultural cooperation, promoting friendship of pupils and teachers.
- Classes in three languages: Albanian/English/ Macedonian and Macedonian/ Albanian/ French

About 180 pupils from the 6th to the 9th grade will have opportunity to celebrate birthday, holiday, religious dates and similar on three languages. On that ocasions, the entire class from the Central school would visit the Satellite school and vice versa, They will have lessons in Macedonian, Albanian and English or French with having fun and multi ethnical cooperation.

- A leaflet 'Know the others know yourself' in Macedonian and Albanian, with a short summary in English, will be prepared by 40 pupils and four teachers in charge, while 6 teachers will be proof-reading texts in Albanian, Macedonian and English.
- Increasing the inclusion of pupils with special educational needs with disabilities in their psychological, physical and intellectual development, of talented pupils and of pupils that are from marginalized groups:

Identification of pupils:

- pupils with learning difficulties,
- Roma pupils that need help in learning,
- Gifted pupils the target group of the project.

Identification process consist of:

- interviewing the teachers,
- insight into pedagogical documentation,
- IQ testing.

The results will be used to make groups for workshops and training.

Learning Space - adapting a classroom for project activities

The classroom for project activities will be equipped with all necessary educational tools: cork board, white board, projector, projector screen, math manipulative, magnets, posters, alphabet aid, paper – white and in colour, geometric shapes and mimeo device – device that turns white board into smart table. Teacher trainings, workshops with parents and regular classes (if needed) will be organized in the *Learning Space*.

Workshops for teachers:

o Developing Individual Learning Plan for working with pupils with learning difficulties,

- Teaching methods for working with pupils with learning difficulties in regular classes
- Working with gifted pupils.
- o There will be 3 workshops x 4 days each.

Peer to peer support classes

Pupils will help Roma pupils in upper primary grades to overcome language problems and barriers which they are still having. This activity is essential for their inclusion in regular classes of all subjects. Pupils who will help them have good results and will voluntary apply for this activity. They will provide for them:

- o 28 classes for reading and writing
- o 28 classes for math

The classes will be held every week and be supervised by teachers. In total there will be 56 peers for peer classes.

***** Workshops for parents:

- 8 workshops for parents of Roma pupils on the importance and necessity of education for better future of their children
- 4 workshops including all parents on finding ways how can parents take part in the school's life
- A monthly meeting "Let's have a coffee together" where parents can talk with teachers in an informal environment. In total, there will be 7 meetings.

Bazaars

We will organize three great events – bazaars, where parents and local community can take part. The bazaars will be organized on the occasion of marking special dates: Schools' day, Easter and Eid.

Project's target groups

Direct beneficiaries: pupils with learning difficulties, Roma pupils, gifted pupils, faculty, staff, parents, in total 600 **Indirect beneficiaries**: all pupils and local community, in total 1000

Providing teaching aid for conducting practical lessons:

Teaching aid consist of mini labs for technical subjects and practical work with machines, such as welding machine, pipe bending machines and similar. Pupils are expected to practice in groups, involving those at risk. Even though the school is new, it faces with a very scarce resources of teaching aid. Literally the practical work is very limited to very few materials that school has. This makes the school very little attractive to pupils, resulting in very poor involvement for all pupils. With provision of teaching aid it is expected that pupils will be well motivated and prepared for their further education. Also it is expected for teachers and pupils to improve performance during teaching and learning lessons.

Organizing supplementary lessons and activities for pupils:

In order to level down social differences among pupils, it is planned to undertake social activities such as sports gaming and competition, and enable them to have common leisure time.

Project's target groups

Direct beneficiaries: at least 50 pupils at high risk and at 350 other pupils; at least 30 teachers

Indirect beneficiaries: at least 300 families, teachers community in municipality

Adaptation of two integrated classrooms

Youth groups and science clubs: activities will be held in integrated classrooms. Pupils at risk are expected to be involved and participate in activities of existing and new established youth and science clubs.

Purpose: Targeted pupils will socialize with other pupils and have improved success. They will be technically and socially prepared, also motivated, for further education. Technological didactic means are very important to create friendly and attractive environment,

Themes of classes: As the teachers will be trained, by expectations, in the field of education for social justice,

Expected topics/subjects are expected to be related to understanding cultural heritage of local people coming from different ethnic backgrounds, introducing peace building concept such as dealing with the past, peer to peer cooperation among pupils belonging to different ethnicities, youth leadership, community based organizing etc.

Experience/best practices exchange

A group of 20 selected pupils at risk and 3 teachers will visit two secondary schools in Tirana, Albania. For about two days of stay, Kosovar pupils will meet at least two school youth groups and school youth clubs in two Tirana secondary schools, which are in similar position/situation and whose pupils are of various ethnic backgrounds such as Roma, rural and disadvantaged neighbourhoods. Pupils will discuss challenges that they face in day-to-day school life. They will share the best practices in overpassing common challenges. This experience will be shared with other pupils of integrated classrooms through discourse. It is expected that pupils from our school will gain ideas for improving performance of student's school clubs. Teachers and selected pupils from other secondary schools in municipality will also participate in continuous discourses that will be organized in integrated classrooms.

Project's main activities:

Promoting children's rights and anti bulling initiatives

The initiatives will focus on advancing the position of children from minority groups and children who are aggressive within the community. All 530 pupils of the school will become aware on anti-bullying procedure and learn more about peace and tolerance. By expectations, after these activities they will be ready and willing to promote peace and tolerance among themselves and other children in community.

To do list:

- Series of campaigns and demonstrations of the importance of peace and tolerance.
- o Drafting a questionnaire in order to understand the needs of pupils and violent cases in their school
- Building more pro-active cooperation of school and community on school activities and initiatives. Both sides need a lot of support and guidance on working together and expanding such activities outside the school boundaries.
- Organizing debates,
- Printing the poster on anti-bulling initiative,
- Theatre play on inclusiveness organized by pupils from 6th to 9th grade and other activities if it is necessary. Each level from 6th to 9th grade will prepare a theatre play and receive a reward from a commission selected by school or MDE. There will be four rewards, one per each grade. The reward will be around 200 Euro and intended for buying books or sport equipment for school.

Peace camp

Members of the Peace Club, trained pupils, will aim to centralise student's voice and actions. They will help school to find pupils with
different problems and invite them to take part in a Peace camp organized by the school. This camp will serve as a positive change to
all those who will be involved. Teachers will prepare agenda according to the needs of student's age.
