## **Component 1 – Pilot Inclusive Schools**


- 49 pilot schools selected / July

- Launching of Inclusive School Network on 6 November in Tirana





## Follow up and next steps

- Baseline research will be carried out by London School of Economics Enterprise
- Pilot schools will start their school-based projects with the support of local implementing partners
- Region-to-region study visit to Grande Region (Belgium, France, Germany, Luxembourg, Netherlands) / March 2014
